

Statement of Evidence:

- 1918 U.S. General Land Office dependent resurvey established this corner and an iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: 4" Tamarac S 15 E 27 links and 4" Tamarac S 34-15 W 32 links. Notes show corner in Tamarac swamp.
- 1976 USFS technician L. Witthoeft found the GLO brass cap monument in place. No evidence was found of the bearing trees.
- 1980 USFS technician W. Olson found the GLO brass cap monument in place up 12". Three new bearing trees were marked and are shown on this certificate. No evidence was found of the 1918 bearing trees. Steel sign posts were set approximately 4 feet west and south of the corner.
- 1981 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- 1981 On Dec. 22, I visited this corner and found items as per the 1980 USFS report. I reviewed chaining notes made by W. Olson to known corners west and north. These measurements agreed well with the 1918 survey. The monument is in tamarac swamp and does not appear to have been moved. Therefor, I accept the found monument as marking the same position as when originally set in 1918.
