

Statement of Evidence:

- 1930 U.S. General Land Office dependent resurvey established this corner and an iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: 6" Birch S $33\frac{1}{2}$ E 42 links and 6" Cedar S $45\frac{1}{2}$ W 37 links.
- 1968 U.S. Forest Service records show the following: L. Martinson found the brass cap monument and the Cedar bearing tree.
- 1981 U.S. Forest Service technician G. Brama found GLO brass cap monument bent to the ground. The pipe was firmly in place and was straightened. The following bearing trees were found: 15" Cedar S 46 W 24.4'. No evidence found of the Birch. Two new bearing trees were marked and are shown on this certificate. A steel sign post was set 1.5' east of the corner.
- 1982 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- 1982 On Sept. 8 I visited the corner and found items as per the 1981 USFS reports. I accepted the monument as marking the same position as when set in 1930 by the GLO resurvey based on the bearing tree found.
