

Northeast Corner of Section 27, Township 140 North, Range 28 West

The following offices were contacted for information on this corner:

Secretary of State

Landecker - Stevenson and Associates, Inc.

- 1870 This corner was established by U.S. General Land Office and marked with a wood post and witnessed by two bearing trees.
- 1917 Notes by John Curo indicate that he found an oak stake, 4" thick in root of old witness tree. He placed an iron pipe at the corner and marked two new tie trees.
- 1959 The DNR Bureau of Engineering found an iron pipe at the corner.
- No Date The alignment map for C.S.A.H. 54 shows an iron pipe at the corner, 691.2 feet south of the centerline of C.S.A.H. 54.
- 1982 Survey by Myron Landecker shows the corner marked with an iron. He gives a distance of 688.48 feet to the centerline of C.S.A.H. 54.
- 1988 A Certificate of Survey by David Landecker shows an iron monument in place at the corner.
- 1988 The DNR Bureau of Engineering found a 2½" iron pipe marking the corner and two tie trees bearing square metal tags. The distance to the centerline of C.S.A.H. 54 proved to be 689.15 feet.

The iron pipe was accepted as marking the corner position.
