

STATEMENT ON EVIDENCE

Meander Corner #9 of Section 25, Township 143 North, Range 29 West of the 5th Principal Meridian.

In 1873, P.H. Conger, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, set a wood post inplace in a bog to mark the location of this corner. No trees near for BT's.

In 1918, Albinus N. Kimmell, U.S. Cadastral Engineer, set a 1x36" iron pipe with a brass cap at record bearing and distance from the Northeast corner of Section 25, while marking the East Township line. No ties were available. Running notes on file in the Cass County Survey Department.

In 1974, the B.L.M. found the iron post with a brass cap that was set in 1918. Information in Cass County Surveyors office.

In 1974, the Cass County Highway Department while working on County Road No. 73 found the brass cap monument. Information in Cass County Surveyors office.

On April 19, 2011, a Northern Engineering & Consulting survey crew found a 1" iron pipe with a 2.5" diameter brass cap, 12" above surface grade, leaning 45 degrees southerly. No ties were found or set. Brass cap monument accepted as the original MC position as reestablished by the GLO in 1918.
