

DOCUMENT NO. 260980

Statement of Evidence:

- 1918 U.S. General Land Office dependent resurvey established this corner and an iron pipe with a marked brass cap was set to mark the corner. The following bearing trees were marked: 10" Ash S 73 E 123 links and 8" Ash S 31 W 147 links.
- 1980 USFS technician Gary Brama found an iron pipe with brass cap 8" above ground and one GLO bearing tree: 12" Ash S 31 W 97.02'. Three new bearing trees were marked and are shown on this certificate. Steel sign posts were set approximately 3 feet east and south of the corner.
- 1981 County Surveyor's Records in the Recorder's Office were checked and no resurvey information was found on this corner.
- 1981 On Dec. 22, I visited this corner and found items as per 1980 USFS report. The 1918 Ash bearing tree to the SW is now a snag and is hollow. No evidence remains of the scribing. No evidence was found of the other GLO bearing tree. Monument is approximately 1 foot southwest of an old corner fence post with old broken down fence lines running east and north. Accepted monument as marking same position as when originally set in 1918.
