Statement of Evidence: MC #32 E.Line Section 28,T.141 N.,R.31 W.,5th P.M.

- 1873 US General Land Office survey set a wood post for this corner and marked the following bearing trees: 7" W. Pine N 34 W 19 lks., 8" W.Oak N 88 E 16 lks.
- 1961 Pete Meyer, RLS #3628, filed an Affidavit as to Location of Government Corner and a Certificate of Survey (filed in Cass County Recorders Office cabinet "E" # 54). He states in 1935 the CCC's found both original BT's. The oak is scribed and Pine scribe overgrown. FS Location poster on the pine. In 1961, the location poster was rusted and not readable, oak stump is mostly decayed and pine is 24" with decayed center. Set a 6" diameter x 5' long concrete monument with 3" bronze tablet. BT's marked: 24" White Pine N 31 E 32.2', 21" Oak S 51½ E 18.7', both marked "MC BT", cedar post 4x4x78" N 2 E 10.0'
- 1980 US Forest Service technician Gary Brama, found original White Pine alive, but hollow. Concrete monument in good shape, 1.5' above ground. 1961 BT's in good condition and cedar post in place. Marked one new BT: 14" W.Oak N 44 E 65.07', scribed "MC S27 BT" Steel sign posts, North 4.2' and South 3.07'
- 1987 Walt Curo, under Forest Service contract, finds all of the 1961 and 1980 evidence in place. I file this certificate to update the 1961 certificate.
